APRIL NEWSLETTER Thought for Lent

Give up the drinking, smoking! Give up eating chocolate, cream cakes, nice desserts! These are often the challenges people opt for during this season of Lent.

In many ways, this is the traditional concept, and it harks back to the medieval interpretation of events. Preceding this period was Carnival when excess was enjoyed, and pancake day is the modern equivalent. The term Carnival stems from the Latin 'Carne Vale', 'carne' being meat or flesh, and 'vale' meaning goodbye. Before that loss, people indulged in feasting and games in preparations for the upcoming deprivation. It was to be supposed to reflect the 40 days and nights that Jesus spent in the wilderness, being tested by privation and then the devil.

Although this would seem a sound way to follow the idea of living a Christ-like life, in fact, the privation is only part of what was being asked of him. Much of this time was preparations for the temptations he was to face. Three times he is confronted by the devil, and three times he resisted those temptations. Adam had failed to achieve this in the Garden of Eden, and had turned the beauty of the Garden into a desert or wilderness, and Christ's denial of the offerings made to him see a potential for the restoration of the relationship between God and humanity through his resistance.

This is Jesus affirming his true self, and confirming that he was ready to accept both his role and his fate.

So how should we treat this season?

We can give up things but that should not be the be-all and end-all for this 'bright, sad' as some describe it. It is a time for reflection and contemplation, a time to reassess priorities, and a time to commit to a new and improved purpose. Lent does employ an underlying sadness – we know the painful and distressing end to part of the narrative, but we also rejoice in its aftermath. On Easter Sunday, we focus on the resurrection and celebrate both a rising from the dead and the implications of that for all believers. Lent, therefore, is a time when we are able to move forward, reasserting and developing our beliefs and looking forward to a bright future.

Ponder: There comes times when all of us feel that we have had enough, and that our strength is gone. It is then, we can turn to the God who loves us, to lift us up and bring us his peace.

Pray: Father, when I am tired and anxious, at the end of my resources, help me to call on you and know your strength, give me courage to face whatever comes, knowing that you love me and care for me. Amen.

Week 3

The poor and needy search for water,...I the Lord will answer them;...I will make rivers flow on barren heights, and springs within the valleys. I will turn the desert into pools of water,... (Isaiah 41:17-18)

Ponder: Just as we need fresh water to sustain life, so we need the water of God's Spirit to sustain us and lead us deeper into more abundant life.

Pray: Father, pour out your Spirit on my heart and mind. May I know your love and grace and peace surrounding me wherever I am. Amen.

Week 4

Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me, will live, even though he dies and whoever lives and believes in me will never die." (John 11: 25-26)

Ponder: In Jesus' promise, we have life not just here and now, but in eternity.

Pray: Father, thank you for your promise of eternal life in Jesus. Deepen my faith and give me hope so that I may trust you for my present and for my eternity. Amen.


