

LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

I have little by the way of family heirlooms in my possession other than perhaps, two things that might now qualify. The first is my paternal grandfather's two World War One medals. One for his army service where he survived a gas attack and had his big toe blown off, and one for the 7 months he spent incarcerated in a WW1 prisoner of war camp. He did not think much of these medals in the light of all the suffering his war service brought to him, but they have passed into my possession.



The second is also from my paternal grandfather. It is

a Windsor fireside chair which he was given for his 21st birthday (a little late because of his war service). As far as I remember from my childhood and early teens, that was always his chair to sit in. Over the years it became blackened and somewhat worn. However, my father had it restored, and I inherited it from him. It is particularly special for me now because it has become my morning devotions chair - the place where I go to sit and read my Bible and pray before breakfast. More than an heirloom, it has become a place of encouragement and blessing.

On one such occasion recently, I was reading from Luke's Gospel, and read these words: 'Each day Jesus was teaching at the temple . . . and all the people came early in the morning to hear him.' Can you imagine that crowd of people, so eager to get up early in the morning to listen to Jesus and learn from all that he was saying? They were excited by his message and could not wait to hear it.

It is our privilege to have in our Bibles, the four Gospel accounts in which so many of those words of Jesus are recorded for us. Do we share that same eagerness to listen to Jesus? Do we feel a similar excitement when we hear those words? Jesus so often speaks into my life through his words that come with the same authority they did 2000 years ago. I pray that each of us have a special place – a chair, a sofa, or a cushion maybe - where we cultivate a habit of coming to hear Jesus speak to us early in the morning, or whenever your day allows.

A marvellous concert by the Choir of Gonville & Caius College Cambridge in Blofield Church on Friday July 5th



A full church appreciated the joy the young choir found in their concert performance of some Howells, Bruckner, Brahms and Britten pieces. The church has wonderful acoustics for this type of classical concert, and they were fully explored with an excellent range of dynamics.

The members of the choir were all individually talented with excellent voices in the full range of sounds. The Brahms, 'How lovely are thy dwellings', which the choir obviously knew well, particularly brought out the best of their group sound as they enjoyed its full range.

The Michael Haydn 'Requiem in C' was very interesting for us all to hear, as it was probably a new arrangement for most listeners. The choir lost themselves in its beauty, following their very talented conductor, Matthew Martin. I look forward to hearing the recording they will be making of this piece, shortly.

The organ scholars, Eden Eyres and Harrison Cole, showed their skill on the beautiful William Hill Organ, so it resounded with Bach's Prelude & Fugue in C.

The hospitality of the church was abundant as usual, with wine and cheese platters, which gave the audience the opportunity to get together and discuss the music in the interval. Many people said how they really appreciated every aspect of the evening.

Heritage Open Days - 6th – 15th September - will soon be here. There is a lot happening in the local area – do pick up the pamphlets available at The Forum and in church.

At Hemblington, we have not one, but two free talks for you to enjoy in the church during Heritage Open Days, both based on the national theme of "Routes, networks and connections". **On Saturday, 7th September (2pm),** the well-known popular presenter Imogen Corrigan, will be discussing "**The Hazards of the Journey**" - Pilgrimage and travel in the Middle Ages. She will be considering how people organised themselves for long journeys, often in appalling conditions, who was travelling and why.

The following Saturday, 14th September (2pm), Joyce and Andrew Burtenshaw (previously of this parish!) will be discussing **"The Journey of St Christopher"**, based on the Golden Legend and the 15th century wall painting in the church.

Both of these events are free to attend, and light refreshments will be available after each talk. There is level access into the church and to the WC.

If you have not been inside All Saints Church, these talks will offer an excellent opportunity to see the lovely little Medieval church with several interesting pre-Reformation features, particularly the impressive wall painting of St Christopher before his conversion to Christianity, and (*spoiler alert!*) his trials and martyrdom when he would not renounce his faith. The church is situated between South Walsham and Blofield - in Church Lane - nearby postcode NR13 4EF.

Saturday, 14th September is also the date for the annual walk/bike/drive fundraiser. If you would like to offer to take part in this, and raise some funds for Hemblington church, please have a word with Catherine, the churchwarden, who will be pleased to give you all the information you will need about this. Stewards are also required in church to sign in visitors, so if you could spare an hour or so for this, again please contact Catherine – (01603) 270 360.




