A LETTER FROM REVD. ANDREW TAPSELL

Last month, the pupils of Hemblington Primary School came to All Saints Church for a day exploring our wonderful churchyard, a haven for wildlife and biodiversity set within the beauty of the surrounding fields. The children enjoyed various crafts and activities, from making seed-bombs to building their own birdfeeders, but it was the moths that seemed to enthral many of them. Various species of moth had been caught the previous night, and



were carefully displayed for observation during the day. Then, at the end of our time together, the moths were released in a moment of joy and freedom. Some of the larger species were even content to settle on a few hands before they took flight.



The sight of the children being so captivated by these small but wondrous creatures. and becoming so delighted as they were set free, has stuck with me. There was something about being able to see these creatures up close, creatures which are usually hidden from us, camouflaged within our surroundings or silently moving by night, that was aweinspiring and humbling. There was a great deal of respect, fascination and curiosity from the children in how they interacted with the moths.

Perhaps then, the humble moth is a good representation of the Holy Spirit. We might catch the occasional glimpse of a moth in flight as the moonlight catches it dancing through the air, but they largely go undetected. However, as a moth is drawn to the light, so the Spirit fills those who shine like lights in the world, and if all of us were only able to take heed of Jesus' words and become more like children, we might just find that, through curiosity and fascination, we are more ready to allow the Holy Spirit the freedom to take flight within us.

Pray: Father God, give me your love and compassion for my brothers and sisters. May I look beyond the surface to the heart, and give me wisdom in my words and deeds to show your love. Amen.

Week 3: You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit – fruit that will last. John 15: 16

Ponder: A tree is known by the fruit it bears. May we be known by the fruit that we bear – love, joy, peace, goodness, kindness and self-control. We can do this because God knows us and has chosen us to do this. We are disciples of Jesus and God calls us to follow his teaching.

Pray: Father God, we thank you that you have chosen us – not because of who we are, nor in spite of who we are, but because you love us. As we follow Jesus' example, as we live our lives, may we bear good fruit for your kingdom. Amen.

Week 4: But when the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth. John 16: 13

Ponder: What a relief that we do not have to try and live as disciples in our own strength. Instead, God has sent his Holy Spirit to live within us and bring his gifts and power. In any situation, we can call on the Spirit to help us, guide us, and empower us for all that we need.

Pray: Father God, thank you for sending the Holy Spirit as our guide and counsellor. Open our ears to hear his gentle voice, and our hearts to understand his loving wisdom. Amen.





PLANTATION ROAD, BLOFIELD

Norfolk County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (the "Order") (NTRO9822), affecting Plantation Road from its junction with North Street for 260m northwards (the "Road") in the Parish of Blofield, to facilitate footway and carriageway resurfacing works. The Road will be temporarily closed (except for pedestrian access) for the duration of the works/period. The closure is necessary, which is anticipated to be from 23rd July to 2nd September 2025, but may continue to be closed/restricted until the 2nd March 2026, where the closure is still required beyond the anticipated dates.



Alternative route is via: North Street, The Street, Yarmouth Road, A47, Shack Lane, Woodbastwick Road (Brundall, Postwick with Witton, Blofield). Vehicular access will be permitted to a final destination in the Road where there are signs indicating it is possible.

The works promoter for this restriction/closure is: Norfolk County Council.

Vehicular access will be permitted to a final destination in the Road where signs indicating such access is possible and permitted are in place.

The Order shall automatically revoke on the completion of the works when the closure is no longer necessary or otherwise on the 2nd March 2026 without further notice.

If necessary, the restriction could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date the Order is effective.

A person who contravenes, or who uses or permits the use of a vehicle in contravention of the closure imposed by the Order shall be guilty of an offence.


Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.


