#### **Spring into summer**

Prayers and reflections for each week - Rules for living as disciples

#### Week 1

Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience. (Colossians 3: 12)

**Ponder:** If we are truly God's chosen and dearly loved people, the way we live needs to reflect who we are in God's kingdom and show his love for others through us.

**Pray:** Loving God, thank you for your love to us; help us to reflect your character as we put on the characteristics that Jesus showed in his time on earth. Amen.

#### Week 2

Bear with each other and forgive whatever grievances you may have against one another. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. (Colossians 3: 13) *Ponder*: It is never easy to forgive words that hurt or deeds that damage us. Yet, true peace and healing come when we forgive and reconcile with one another. Forgiveness is an act of will, not an emotion, so we can persevere, remembering that we too have been forgiven.

**Pray:** Loving God, help us not to hold on to hurts and grievances, but to be big enough to forgive and let them go. Help us to deal with our pain and receive your healing. Amen.

#### Week 3

And over all these virtues put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity. (Colossians 3: 14)

**Ponder:** Love is the cement that holds the bricks together and makes the building strong. We are all members of one body – the church – and we are called to love one another.

**Pray:** Loving God, open our hearts to receive your love and give us generosity to pass that love on to others. Help us to be inclusive because we are family; we all belong to you and are made in your image. Amen.

#### Week 4

Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace and be thankful. (Colossians 3: 15)

**Ponder:** Sometimes it is good to look back and count our blessings; it helps put our problems into perspective. If we let the peace of Christ rule in our hearts, we do not need to be anxious or fretful, and we can be thankful to God for his goodness to us.

**Pray:** Loving God, when we are fearful or anxious, fill our hearts and minds with the peace of Christ, that we may find security and freedom in him.

#### VE DAY – 80 YEARS! A TRIBUTE TO THE GREATEST GENERATION

The bunting fluttered outside, the St George flag was hoisted on the tower and the VE Union flag welcomed people into the church. The flowers, the food and the tables were prepared for 80 guests. Every tiny detail was taken care of, including making sure five residents of Manor House were brought in wheelchairs and safely seated to



enjoy the festivities with a glass of bubbly.

There was great excitement as the Deputy Lord Lieutenant, Carol Bundock, was greeted, and welcomed. With heads bowed, all was still for the two minutes silence to remember all those who never returned. David said Grace before the meal and cottage pie and vegetables were served seamlessly to ten tables, hot and delicious! This was followed with traditional trifle.

As the music began, and 'Deano' started singing songs from the war years, Carol moved around the tables, chatting to everyone and reminiscing about the war years. What a wonderful moment to see the folk from Manor House singing their hearts out and remembering every word of the songs they'd sung more than 80 years before.

With memories and new friends made, every one left and the tidying began. Thank you, Sarah and the extended hospitality team, for all your hard work.

Memories and Thanks for a Special VE Day Service - 11th May Sunday dawned, the sun shone and the promise of yet another memorable day had arrived. It was time for our Service of Remembrance for VE Day, led by Revd. Ron Ingamells. The Deputy Lord Lieutenant, Bryony Falkus, was led to her seat by the wardens, and Revd. Ron took us back to the second world war that he recalled so vividly. The joys, the fears, all intermingled in his telling of that dreadful time. He read the poem by William Blake – JOY AND WOE which helped us understand some of the pain and sorrow experienced. At the end of the service, the wardens led The DLL and John, a church representative, to the memorial to lay wreathes of remembrance.


