

MARCH NEWSLETTER

March is the most wonderful time of transformation as the icy air of winter gives way to the first hopeful hints of spring. The quiet countryside begins to stir from its slumber; snow drops, daffodils, crocuses, tulips and many more begin their cycle of reawakening from the frozen earth.

Trees take on that pale lime green hue of new life that always reminds me of one of my little grandsons, some years ago when I picked him up from nursery, aged just three. He sat in the back of the car looking out of the window, and a little voice asked, "*Grandma*, who put the leaves on the trees?" Spring is a time of wonder and awe, not just for young children but for us too.

The word Lent comes from an Old English word, *lencten*, meaning 'spring season.' A time for renewal and preparation for Easter, to prepare for spiritual growth, and to remember Christ's time in the desert. Lent is a time of reflection, prayer, penance and change.

Lent, this year, begins on Ash Wednesday, 5th March and, for the next forty days, Christians are called to pray, fast and give alms to the poor. Giving up chocolate would not be much of a personal sacrifice because I know I can replace it with cake or biscuits. However, I hope I will continue to be generous and offer acts of kindness whenever I have the opportunity, and I will pray for family, friends and the many needs of the world. I also hope to join one of the many Lent courses being offered in our Deanery to learn, reflect and pray.

Finding solitude in my 'wilderness' will be the most challenging. In the busyness of a large family, church commitments and an interregnum, this will take real discipline so that I am not distracted. It will be a time to think of Jesus's sacrifice for each and every one of us and hope of personal spiritual change and growth.

Reflections for March 2025 - Welcome to Spring

The beauty of creation

Read: The heavens extol the glory of God; the firmament testifies to his handiwork. Each day witnesses eloquently and each night communicates knowledge, without need of speech, language or any other voice. Their music pervades all the earth; the words of their mouth reach out to the furthest parts of the world. Psalm 19:1-4.

Ask yourself: What aspects of creation speak most powerfully to you of God? In what ways are you helping to preserve the environment and in what ways are you guilty of exploring it?

Pray: Gracious God, open my eyes to the loveliness of this word and in honouring your creation may I honour you. Amen.

The gift of hope

Read: My soul waits quietly for God; my confidence comes from him. He, and he alone, is my rock, my deliverance and my stronghold; nothing will shake me. Psalm 62: 5-6.

Ask yourself: Does the thought of the future fill you with confidence or dread? Do you feel able to leave your ultimate destiny in the hands of God, confident that, whatever you may face, he will finally make all things work together for good?

Pray: Loving God, send me back into the world renewed in hope and restored in faith, to live and work for you. Amen.

Celebrating the new morning

Read: Satisfy us each morning with your unanswered love, so that we may rejoice and celebrate all our days. Psalm 90: 14.

Ask yourself: Do you still welcome each day as a gift? Do you need to reexamine your sense of perspective?

Pray: Loving God, I thank you for the gift of this and every day. I praise you for all the possibilities each brings. Teach me to count my blessings and to welcome this day as your gift, consecrating it to your service in grateful praise, through Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen.

Your God needs you!

Read: How can they cry out to someone they have not believed in? How can they believe in someone they have never heard of? And how can they hear of him unless someone proclaims it to them? And how can anyone proclaim unless they are sent? Romans 10: 14-15.

Ask yourself: Have you taken seriously God's need of you? Are you guilty sometimes, of wondering why he hasn't answered your prayers, when the reality is that you have failed to help answer them yourself?

Pray: Lord Jesus Christ, you have touched my life, brought me joy and given me life in all it's fullness. Equip me now, through your Spirit, to make you known and share with others the blessing I have found in you, for your name's sake. Amen.

This is the day

Read: This is the day that the Lord has made: let us celebrate and rejoice in it. Psalm 118: 24.

Ask yourself: How often do you stop and simply enjoy the present moment? How often do you make a point of thanking God for it?

Pray: Gracious God, teach me to take each moment as it comes and to live it to the full, through Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen.


