LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

It is not very often that I take the time to read a book unless it has some relevance to Biblical studies or theology, but when Helene and I were visiting some friends recently, they had a book on their coffee table which caught my eye, so much so that I bought my own copy to read. It was a book by Michael Palin, called 'Erebus: The Story of a Ship'. It is a story of adventure and discovery in both the Arctic and Antarctic by two Naval vessels, Erebus and Terror, in the early 19th century. It is based on much historical fact and quotes historical sources, but there is also some reimagination of the story.



In one of the scenes, Erebus is caught between two icebergs with the walls of ice rapidly bearing down on the ship. The crew expect a miserable end. The only gap available for the ship to escape catastrophe is closing fast. The captain courageously takes two risky decisions - a great gamble - which enable the ship to reverse from the wall of ice, turn and set the main sail in appalling and dangerous sea conditions, and head out of the gap. They make it, just. It was a thrilling bit of the story to read.

In their written recollections that followed, senior members of the crew could only attribute their deliverance to 'God Almighty' and to 'a most wonderful interposition of divine providence'. Somewhat haughtily, Michael Palin suggests it was "all down to the captain and his seamanship rather than the almighty himself that saved the lives of his men".

I think, from his totally secular viewpoint, Michael Palin has failed to understand that God's providence is not in competition with human wisdom and bravery. The scripture tells us God is kind and loving towards all He has made. God often works through the decisions that competent, dutiful, and brave people take. He doesn't need to reach down from heaven like a modern-day Poseidon. God is always at work through human agency.

In the month when we celebrate Pentecost and the coming of the Spirit into the lives of the disciples of Christ, we believe that the Spirit comes to help us to live our lives for the good of our fellow humans, by doing God's will and work. Amongst the fruit that the Spirit produces in our lives as we seek to "live by the Spirit", are kindness and goodness. We should never be reluctant to thank God for spiritual fruit and gifts in the life of others that bring encouragement and help — even deliverance - into our lives.

Read: Ruth said, 'do not urge me to turn back and abandon you. Wherever you go, I will go; wherever you stop, I will stop; your people will be my people, and your God my God. (Ruth 1:16-17)

Ask yourself: What kind of friend are you to others? How deep is the commitment you put into your relationships.

Pray: Gracious God, teach me today the meaning of friendship, to others and to you. Through Jesus Christ my Lord. Amen

When one door closes

Read: Coming with the gospel to Troas, I found the Lord had opened a door for me there (2 Corinthians 2.12)

Ask yourself: Have doors seemed to close in your life? Could it be that God is looking to lead you in a new direction?

Pray: Loving God, through all that life brings and in all the challenges I face, help me to see the way forward and to follow where you would lead me through Jesus Christ my Lord. Amen

Sowing the seed

Read: Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to all creation. (Mark 16:15)

Ask yourself: Have you taken seriously the call to share your faith? When did you last witness to Christ?

Pray: Lord Jesus Christ, I cannot make disciples on my own, but I can play my part in sowing the seed for you to nurture. Help me to do that faithfully, conscious of my privilege and responsibility, for your name's sake. Amen

Some May dates in the History of Norwich 1st May 1844

The first train in Norfolk, to carry passengers, left Great Yarmouth into Norwich at 8.00am on the 1st May 1844. Since the opening of the Stockton & Darlington Railway in 1825, every town and city wanted to join the new transport craze and have a railway.

Yarmouth was a natural choice of partner for the first route in Norfolk, being the trade port of Norwich and an increasing popular seaside resort. In 1842, the Yarmouth and Norwich Railway company was created. Work began in April 1843 and took a total of 1500 men to complete, with the formal opening of Norwich station occurring approximately a year later on 30th April 1844.

On the 1st May 1844, 200 privileged guests travelled by train from Norwich at 10.30am, leaving to the sounds of a brass band playing "See the Conquering Hero Comes". It took 50 minutes, with third-class passengers left unprotected against the elements and without seats. The new railway brought commercial benefits to Norwich, with approximately 60cwt of tea and coffee brought by rail in August 1844 for Messrs. Wolton & Co. alone.

The Trowse swing bridge was completed in December 1845, making a direct journey from Yarmouth to London possible and cutting the time in half, compared to travelling by stagecoach. Modernisation had arrived, and by 1882, Norwich had three stations: Thorpe, Victoria and City.



24th May 1899

Norwich celebrated the opening of the Royal Arcade on the 24th May 1899. The Victorian shopping arcade was designed by George Skipper, and is an exquisite example of Art Nouveau style. The walls were decorated with tiles inspired by nature and femininity, whilst the high ceiling of glass and timber, along with stained-glass panels, created a light and airy space, while protecting shoppers from the elements. It was restored in 1980 and is regarded as one of the greatest architectural examples of a Victorian shopping arcade and

still provides a shopping experience for visitors to Norwich.

George Skipper is the architect responsible for many of Norwich's grand buildings, including the Jarrolds department store. Skipper attended the Norwich School of Art for one year, and trained in London as an architect for three years before returning to his father's firm, where he announced the opening of his own practice by painting "Architect" above the door of his office.


