LETTER FROM OUR RECTOR

September brings us to the start of Autumn, and for our churches, a Sunday service set aside to give thanks for the harvest. The harvest festival and the decoration of our churches with floral displays, harvested produce, and a collection of processed foods in tins and wrappers to donate to food banks is a reminder of God's blessing of the earth which he has created and which he sustains.

When we pray the prayer that Jesus taught his disciples – the Lord's Prayer - the words, 'Give us this day our daily bread', are a reminder that we are ever



dependent upon God's generosity and providential kindness for our daily needs. The disciples of the 1st century were acutely aware of this, as many of them lived from hand to mouth each day. Yet, still Jesus told them not to worry excessively, but to put their faith and trust in God for each day's needs. I think we can demonstrate that faith, when we ourselves are generous to others in need as part of our harvest thanksgiving.

Also, in the Lord's Prayer, Jesus teaches his disciples to pray "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." A reminder to us all that while the stewardship of the earth and caring for the environment is important, an even greater responsibility is the stewardship of our lives in relation to God and his kingdom. For that, we also need God's generous provision. We need living bread - Jesus, the bread of life.

As I think about Autumn, it is also a reminder to me that at the end of September, I will step into retirement. Perhaps, you might say, the autumn of my own life. I do so with a sense of gratitude to God for his goodness and kindness to me but also, with a desire to continue to be fruitful in his service.

Reflections for September 2024 The season starts to change

Under the carpet

Read: Hatred stirs up strife, but love covers over all offences. (Proverbs 10: 12)

Ask yourself: Are you willing to forgive and forget, or do you brood over hurts inflicted on you, allowing them to fester deep inside? Is God calling you to put an end to some long running grievance or dispute?

Pray: Lord Jesus Christ, as you have forgiven me, teach me to forgive others, wholly and unreservedly, for your name's sake. Amen.

A point of reference

Read: I, the Lord, do not change. (Malachi 3: 6)

Ask yourself: do you feel overwhelmed by changes taking place in your life, or depressed by the rapid pace of change around you? Have you lost sight of God, the same yesterday today and tomorrow?

Pray: Living God keep my eyes fixed on you, no matter what happens, assured that though all else may fade away, your love will remain the same, unchanged and unchangeable. In Christ's name, I ask it. Amen.

An unwitting mistake

Read: You know my folly, O God; there can be no hiding my wrongs from you. (Psalm 69: 5)

Ask yourself: what inadvertent mistakes have you made recently? What caused them? What might have avoided them? Have you put them behind you?

Pray: Living God, flawed and fallible though I am, work within me by your grace to do your will and fulfil your purpose, through Christ my saviour. Amen.

Inner Peace

Read: peace I leave with you: my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. (John 14: 27)

Ask yourself: do you feel at peace with yourself? Is your life based on the things that really matter?

Pray: Loving God, wherever i am, wherever I go, whatever i do, however I feel, I know that you will be with me, to hold, to heal, to guide and to bless. So, I will go in peace, assured of your unfailing love. Amen.

The everlasting arms

Read: The eternal God is your dwelling place, and underneath are the everlasting arms. (Deuteronomy 33: 27)

Ask yourself: do you feel vulnerable and alone? Are you scared of what the future might hold? Have you lost sight of the encircling arms of God?

Pray: Living God, embrace me in your arms, and circle me with your grace and infold me in your love, for Jesus' sake. Amen.

Bell Ringers News

In a previous article, I spoke about the social aspect of bellringing and as an example I will tell you about the tower tour in which I joined, with the bell ringers from St John the Baptist Church, Reedham in June this year. We met at the church and after using the ferry, we firstly went to Woodton church (6 bells) and then Shotesham where I rang the oldest bell which I have ever done, cast about 1420 AD. After a picnic lunch in the bright sunshine, we travelled to Brooke where I rang the heaviest bell which I have ever rung at 1300cwt (660kg). Don't worry about the weight of the bell - you don't have to LIFT it. The bell is firmly attached, and vou are merely in control of the SWINGING of it. Finally, we travelled to Bergh Apton church, and then on to tea and cake at a local garden centre. A wonderful day was had by all, and I have included a photograph of us at Shotesham church, where the



ringing chamber is accessed by a steep spiral staircase on the outside of the church. The bell ringers are isolated from the nave and cannot see what is going on, so there is a small bell operated by a string whereby a church warden can signal when the bells are required to start and stop. Anybody interested is welcome to come to Blofield practise night on Thursdays at 7:30pm and see what we do.

News from Hemblington (with Pedham) Parish Council
